Observation missions



- Russia (Ukrainian hostages in the RF)
 - abduction of Ukrainian citizens on the territory of the RF (Oleg Sentsov and a group of iactivists of the Crimean EuroMaidan ; Nadiya Savchenko)
 - missions to Voronezh and Moscow (6 missions between 16 July and 16 November, 2014)
 - engagement of Polish and European parliamentarians
 - meetings with the Russian civil society, the media and investigation officials, observation of court trials
 - a lengthy legal battle
 - need for further engagement and international pressure



Observation missions



- Observation of presidential elections in May 2014
 - international short-term mission (15 observers: Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Canada; 5 cities: Kyiv, Odessa, Vinnytsia, Chernigov, Lvov)
- Support of international missions (organisation and logistics as well as pertaining to the merits)
 - foreign delegations (politicians, journalists, experts)
 - electoral observation missions (presidential and parliamentary)
- International reporting and the ATO zone
 - journalists - volunteers
 - Agnieszka Paulina Górska (the media, social media, maidan24.pl)
 - identification of needs for aid



Observation missions. The ATO zone





Collection of financial donations



- new target groups: ATO soldiers, displaced people and refugees
- large fluctuations (depending on situational conditions)
- cooperation with local branches of the Union of Ukrainians in Poland – participation in the Ukrainian culture festivals in Poland;
- complemented by the collection of material gifts (items to keep warm: the action *Share your warmth*) to an indeterminable value
- up-to-date reporting on Facebook and in the media
- the funds raised are transferred in full to the missions and to provide humanitarian aid



Collection of financial donations



A total of **1.003.009,69 PLN** was collected





Collection of financial donations





- transport: volunteers, own convoys, collaborating organisations (The 'Pokolenie' Association)
- complicated legal conditions (unclear regulations, the need to obtain licenses)
- Polish and Ukrainian bureaucracy
- corruption - the principle of delivering aid to direct beneficiaries (limited trust, avoiding abuse)
- the need to ensure the safety of transport and people

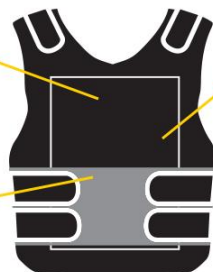
Lubig to! 10 tys.



Due to the ballistic filler (most frequently made of Kevlar), it provides protection against bullets fired from small arms and grenade shrapnel.



Most frequently needed is vest Class IV: it protects the person against Caliber 7.62 mm armor-piercing bullets as well as bullets of lower velocity, such as cartridges fired from an automatic rifle AK47.



There are 5 classes of body vests (IIA, II, IIIA, III, IV). The higher the class, the more effective protection of the life of the person wearing it is provided. There are several standards which describe ballistic penetration resistance of vests. Class IV vest (according to NIJ standard) corresponds to Class 5 of the German DIN standard or Class B7 of the European CEN standard.

- **lustration:** cooperation with the Lustration Committee, conferences and seminars, study visits, demonstrations, information campaign, draft legislation, expertise, Lustration Law, membership in the Lustration Council (Lyudmyla Kozlovska – President of the ODF)
- **decentralisation:** cooperation with a team of Polish experts and local government MEP officials Marcin Świącicki; seminars with the participation of Polish and Ukrainian local government officials
- projects to **combat corruption** in the law enforcement ministries

Trainings for entrepreneurs



- the project *Supporting the entry of Ukrainian SMEs to the EU market* financed and implemented in cooperation with the International Renaissance Foundation;
- information meetings and training workshops for entrepreneurs in 4 cities: Kharkov, Zaporozhe, Dnepropetrovsk and Odessa - attended by more than 150 SMEs
- subjects: the EU as a sales market, certification of products on the EU markets, supporting the export activities, customs regulations, marketing, etc.

Analytical activities (reports)



OPEN DIALOG

- ODF analysis team Kyiv & Warsaw
- monitoring of human rights violations (the case of V. Rybak, O. Sentsov, N. Savchenko);
- monitoring of the implementation of key reforms (decentralisation, lustration, economic reform)
- economic analysis (including disbursements from international financial assistance - the EU, IMF and the impact of an association agreement with the EU on the economy of Ukraine)
- publication of 16 reports
- publication of approx. 50 papers



Lobbying for Ukraine



- politicians and opinion leaders (NGOs, think-tanks)
- launching operations in new countries - USA and Israel
- liberalisation of regulations concerning the delivery of humanitarian aid, including franchised protective equipment
- fight against Russian propaganda
- introduction of sanctions against Russia (by the EU, USA, but also Ukraine) and its political and economic elites



Lobbying for Ukraine



- support for the Ukrainian armed forces
- release of Ukrainian political prisoners by Russia
- cessation of cooperation of Ukrainian law enforcement (General Prosecutor's Office) and judicial bodies with Russia
- monitoring of foreign assistance funds disbursed by Ukraine in order to prevent corruption

Finance and accounts

- medical assistance: 146,488.62 PLN
- assistance for journalists: 39,514.90 PLN
- assistance for refugees: 41,606.18 PLN
- assistance for the Maidan Self-Defence and law enforcement structures: 533,172.60 PLN
- assistance for NGOs: 55,242.16 PLN
- **total value of the rendered assistance: 816,024.46 PLN**
- **costs relating to observation missions and support: 187,068.23 PLN (during the Maidan)**
- **total cost of the above listed actions: 1,003,092.69 PLN**



Summary



- massive organisational and financial effort
- flexible response and use of emerging opportunities
- crises (kidnapping of an observer S. Lefter)
- legal battles (prosecution proceedings and criminal fiscal proceedings)
- active Russian propaganda (support for Europe's extreme right and left wing)



Summary



- accusations of financing by the oligarchs, embezzlement, *Jewish Banderism, judeo-satanism*, fascism, Nazism, activities promoting hostile ideology (working for the benefit of Ukraine, Russia, the US, Israel ... *you name it*), warmongering, provoking conflicts, spreading propaganda of success (effective PR)
- good cooperation with the Embassy of Ukraine
- problematic cooperation with some of the Ukrainian state structures



Current and planned activities



- commemoration of the Heavenly Sotnia - Heroes of the Maidan, in Warsaw
- the #NasTuNieMa ['WeAreNotHere'] exhibition, documenting the presence of Russian troops in Ukraine
- development of the Ukrainian World
- extending the team of reporters
- focusing on lustration and pro-lustration activities
- anti-corruption programme (mainly in the law enforcement bodies)
- training of public officials
